As an intelligence officer, Brian was responsible for providing analytic products to senior US Government customers at the White House and National Security Council, as well as fast-turnaround, mission-critical analytic support to Agency operational activities.

Brian has covered a broad spectrum of intelligence topics including al-Qa'ida and other international terrorist activity, threat warning and indication analysis, illicit money laundering, counterproliferation, organized crime, and Middle East economic development. He has worked jointly with colleagues at the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the National Security Agency (NSA), and the Department of Justice (DOJ) in support of national-level counterterrorism initiatives. In August 2003, Brian was awarded the CIA's Exceptional Accomplishment Award for his work in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Brian is a graduate of the Career Analyst Program at the CIA's Sherman Kent School for Intelligence Analysis.

Earlier in his career, Brian taught at and jointly managed the operation of an English language program in rural Hungary. He also served as Head Clerk to the Courts of Justice Committee of the Senate of Virginia.
